Project Information

Resurfacing begins the week of August 10 on State Road (S.R.) 30A (U.S. 98/15th Street) from west of Jenks Avenue to S.R. 389 (East Avenue) in Bay County. The project includes:

- New sidewalks along the north side of 15th Street and at East Avenue
- Accessibility ramp improvements
- Milling and resurfacing
- Curb and gutter improvements
- Traffic signalization improvements
- Two bus stop turnouts located at McKenzie Avenue and Maple Avenue
- Additional turn lanes and shoulder widening at East Avenue
- Intersection radius widening
- Drainage improvements
- Highway signage improvements

To reduce traffic congestion, there will be no daytime lane closures from 6:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. between Jenks Avenue and East Avenue. No detours or other major traffic impacts are anticipated. Access to businesses will be maintained. Work is anticipated to be complete summer 2016.

The U.S. 98 (15th Street) project includes new sidewalks on 15th Street and at East Avenue, accessibility ramp improvements, milling and resurfacing, curb and gutter improvements, and traffic signalization improvements. The project also incorporates two bus stop turnouts located at McKenzie Avenue and Maple Avenue, additional turn lanes and shoulder widening at East Avenue, intersection radius widening, drainage improvements, and highway signage improvements.

Progress Update

The contractor has completed more than two miles of new sidewalk and driveway improvements along the north side of U.S. 98 (15th Street) from Harrison Avenue to East Avenue.

Additional completed improvements include:

- Stormwater structures at East Avenue
- Roadway base widening at U.S. 98 (15th Street) and East Avenue
- Underground directional boring for signalization conduit at several locations
- Concrete embankment walls at State Road 77 (Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard) and East Avenue
- Bay Town Trolley stop base and curb construction at McKenzie Avenue and Maple Street

What to expect over the next three months

The contractor will continue to primarily work evenings, 7 p.m. until 6:30 a.m., to minimize impacts to property owners and the traveling public.

Major items to be completed include:

- Remaining sidewalk and driveway improvements
- Construct seven new traffic signal mast arms at Harrison Avenue, Sherman Avenue, and East Avenue
- Widen travel lane and shoulder along both sides of East Avenue
- Complete stormwater drainage structure installation at East Avenue, Redwood Avenue, and Harris Avenue
- Resurface, stripe, and place new signs on the entire corridor

Work is projected to be complete summer 2016.

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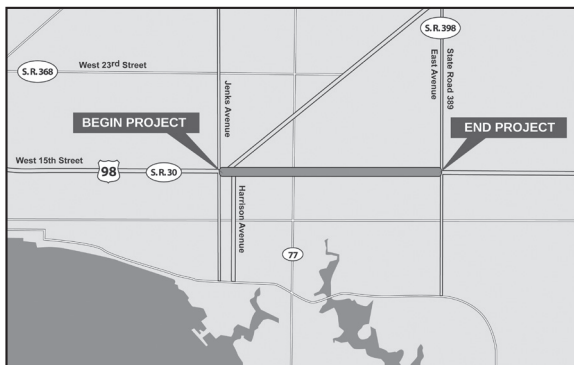

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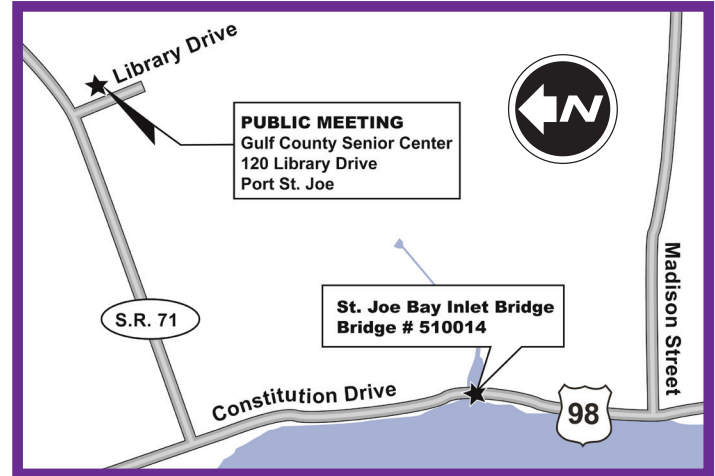

Project Information

The intent of this project is to replace the existing bridge on U.S. 98 over Saint Joe Bay Inlet with a new concrete structure. Improvements include new guardrail, minor drainage improvements, sodding, and placement of new pavement markings. Additional right-of-way and temporary construction easements may be required for construction of the proposed bridge. Bids for construction are scheduled to be received summer 2019.

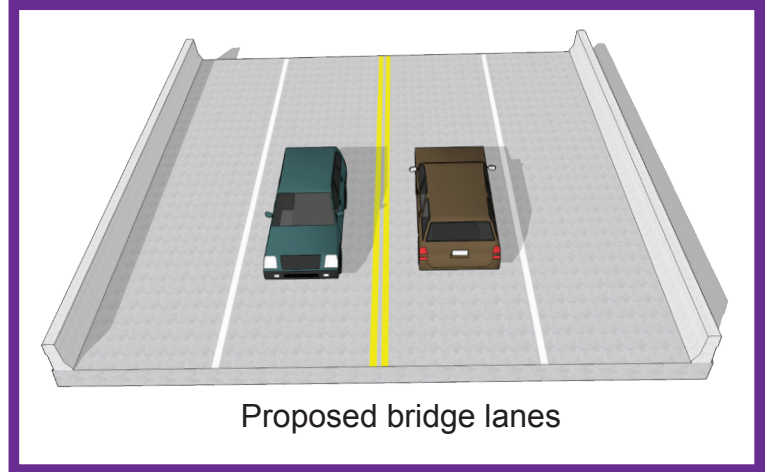
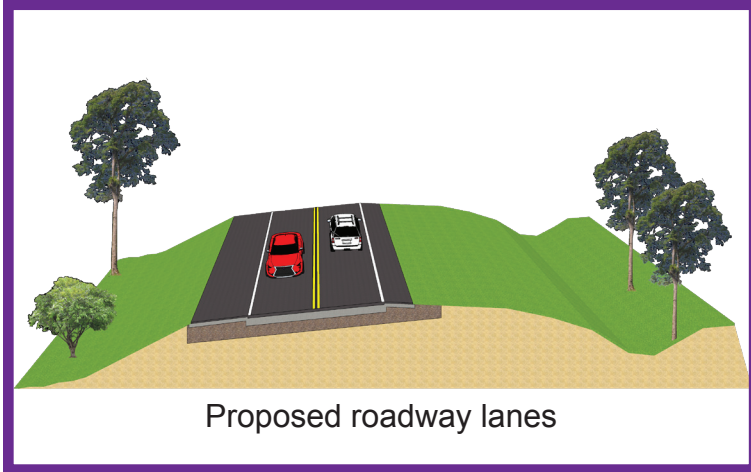

Roadway Typical Section

The two-lane rural typical section has the following features:

- Two twelve foot wide travel lanes in each direction
- A ten foot wide shoulder on the east - five foot wide paved shoulder and five foot sodded
- A ten foot wide paved shoulder on the west
- Open ditch drainage

Bridge Typical Section

The two-lane bridge typical section has the following features:

- Two twelve foot wide travel lanes in each direction
- Ten foot wide shoulders in each direction

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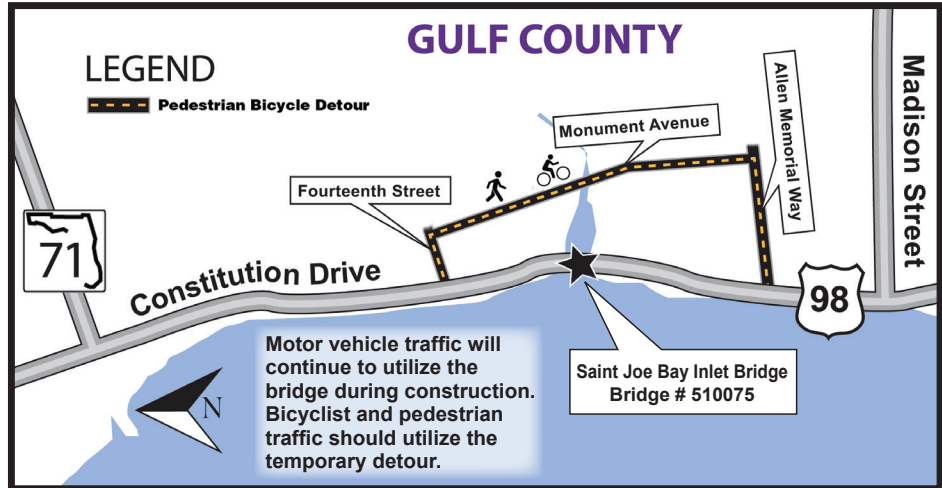

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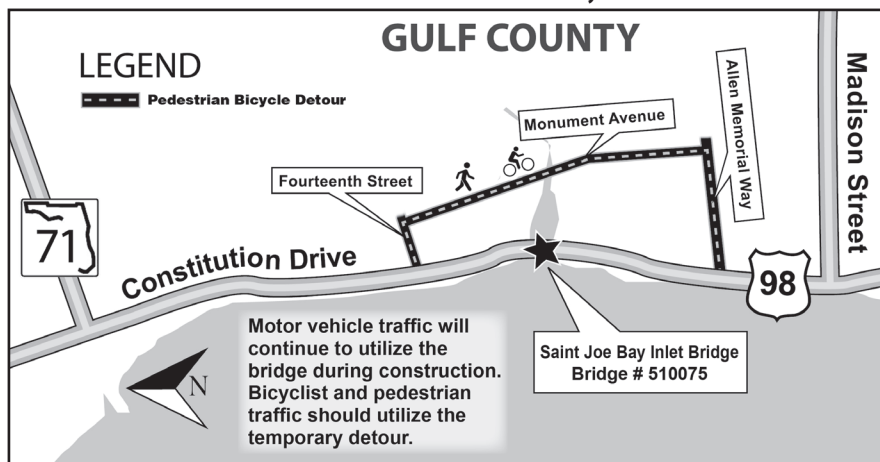
